A transfer student admitted to the University at Albany who has completed his/her A.A. or A.S. degree will be given credit for meeting SUNY's General Education requirements.

Criminal Justice is a restricted major at the University at Albany. Thus, all students must apply for admission to the major. Transfer students have two avenues through which they can be admitted to the undergraduate criminal justice major.

- Transfer students may apply to the major upon admittance to the University if they have achieved a grade of B or better in RCRJ 201, RCRJ 202 or RCRJ 203 (equivalent courses at their prior college will be recognized as meeting this requirement if they received a B or better in those courses). Their application will be evaluated and compared to other applicants by the Associate and Assistant Deans. The evaluation will primarily focus on their overall GPA and the required essay. The best applicants will be admitted until we have reached our targeted number of majors.
- Students transferring to the University of Albany become eligible for guaranteed admission to the Criminal Justice major under the same guidelines for native-students. Specifically, to qualify for guaranteed admission transfer students must have:
  - Achieved a cumulative GPA of 3.20 or higher following completion of at least 56 credits (of which 30 credit hours must be taken at the University at Albany)
  - Earned a grade of B or better in two of the following courses - RCRJ 201, 202 or 203 or equivalents
  - Completed the statistics and research methods classes required of majors (RCRJ 281 and 282, or equivalents) with a grade of B or better.
